



Ten years ago, Hayo Loacker, inspired by the vineyard classification in Burgundy, began to closely observe the terroir and growth of the vines at Corte Pavone in Montalcino. His vision was to produce individual Crus of Brunello di Montalcino. After years of experimenting with dynamic micro-parcelling on the entire estate we identified various growing zones and seven single vineyards of Brunello - the "7 DYNAMIC BRUNELLO CRUS". The Crus are dynamic because for each vineyard the final grape selection is optimised individually, using new measurements at the time of harvesting.

### 3 Poggio Molino al Vento



The name of the biggest cru vineyard „Molino al Vento“ (en. Windmill) is due to the wind coming from the sea, which always rushes through the vines and most probably used to operate a windmill in this area.

**Character:** The elegant one

**Terroir:** Rocky Galestro soil. The soil with the most balanced share of sand, silt and clay.

**Vineyard:** The largest but also the most variable during harvest

**Size:** 0,66 - 1,62 ha | 3 American Football fields (vintage dependent)

### 4 Fiore del Vento



The anemone (it. Fiore del Vento - en. Windflower) feels and reacts to every little breeze, it is a very delicate & sensitive flower - just like the wine „Fiore del Vento“.

**Character:** The expressive charmer

**Terroir:** Rocky, chalky, and loamy soil. The rockiest soil.

**Vineyard:** Late harvester

**Size:** 0,71-0,91 ha | almost 1 soccer field (vintage dependent)

### 5 Anemone al Sole



Anemone al Sole. The name of this Cru location is derived from anemos (gr. Wind) and sole (it. Sun). Here the hot south-east Scirocco wind blows through the vineyard.

**Character:** The complex one

**Terroir:** Rocky, chalky, and loamy soil. The most chalky soil.

**Vineyard:** The most complex plant phenotypology

**Size:** 0,4 - 0,68 ha | 2 tennis courts (vintage dependent)

### 1 Campo Marzio



Campo Marzio was a war field in ancient Rome and the scene of many great preparations for war. The Cru „Campo Marzio“ is our little warrior, the vineyard with the oldest vines and most vintages. A wine with staying power.

**Character:** The powerful aristocrat

**Terroir:** A mix of Galestro, rocks, and clay. The loamiest terrain.

**Vineyard:** History mingling with the oldest vines

**Size:** 0,95-1,6 ha | 1 soccer field (vintage dependent)

### 2 Fior di Meliloto



The Cru "Fior di Meliloto" (en. Sweet yellow clover) is appropriately named as the wine produced from this vineyard - the most flowery, fruity character of all the dynamic Crus.

**Character:** The fruity one

**Terroir:** Galestro – sandy soil, little lime. The purest Galestro soil.

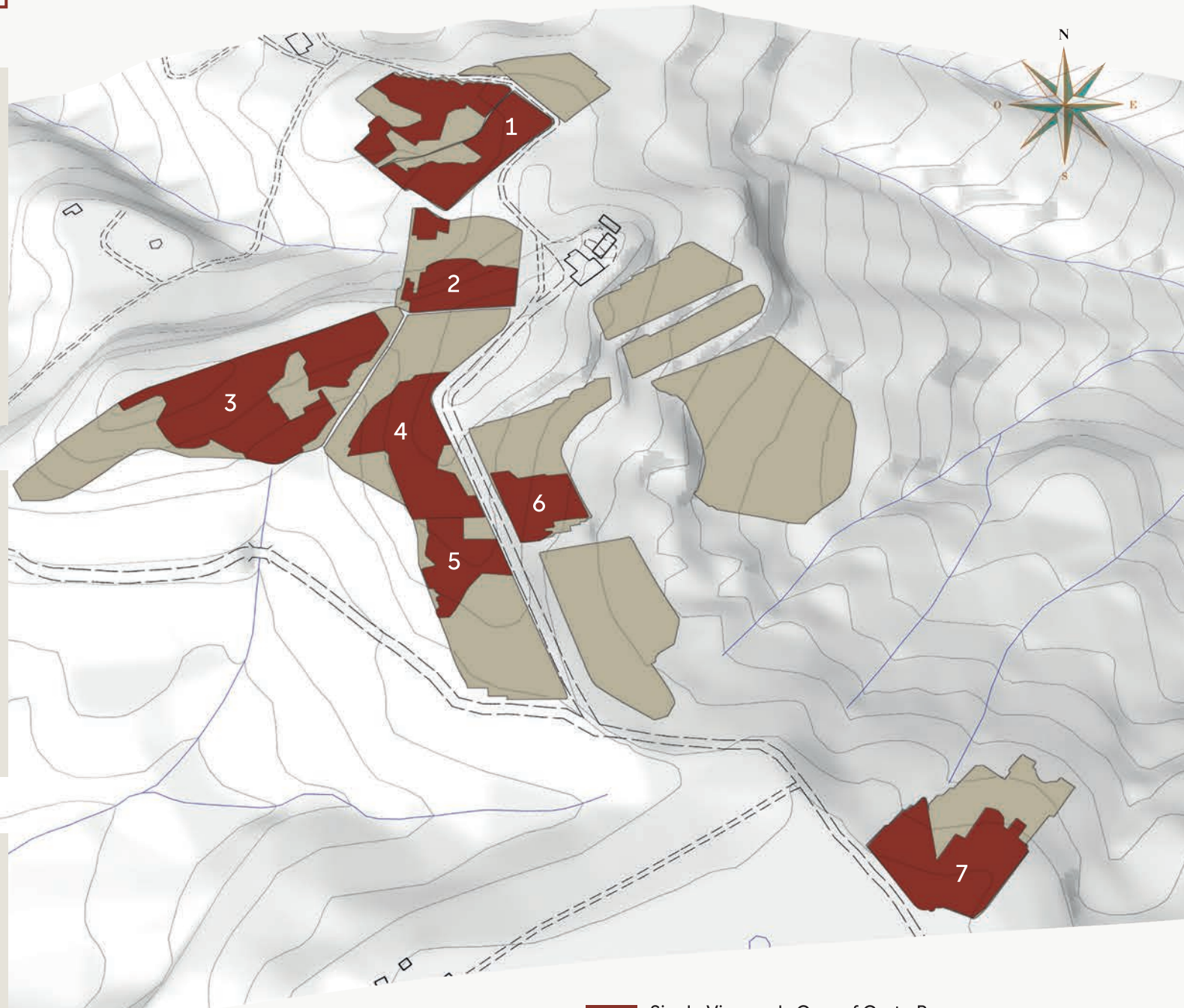
**Vineyard:** Early harvester, north orientation

**Size:** 0,62 - 0,76 ha | 2 Basketball courts (vintage dependent)

These two Crus were planted in 2014 & 2016. We have put all our knowledge from the past years observations into these vineyards and we cannot wait to harvest their first Brunello Cru Vintage. However, we still need to be patient - the first Vintage will not be produced before 2030.
